Phase two of the operation, the focus is on the Logistics support service (LSU) incorporating cargo handling equipment, Port capacity development and latent cargo forecasting. www.wfpls.org

OVERVIEW - CURRENT OPERATIONS

World Food Programme operations now focus on:

Logistics Support	Providing logistics support & consultancy to private sector and humanitarian organizations operating in the NAD-Nias area; Rental of cargo handling equipment
Training and ports institutional capability	Assessing & evaluating ports & institutional capability, procuring and arranging training for staff located at 15 Ports in NAD - Nias
Identification and quantification of cargo prospects	Providing 'latent' cargo demand forecasting & developing a database of existing and potential cargo, linking port gateways to the hinterland and livelihood projects.

The operation has established offices and equipment located in Nias (Gunung Sitoli), Simeulue (Sinabang) and Banda Aceh (Ulee Lhee & Lhoknga)

Port Capacity Development NAD – Nias update

Following the opening of the "Port Training and Capacity Development Programme" on 15 December 2008, the "**Port General Management**" module commenced on 5 Jan and ended on 8 Jan with 13 participants receiving Certificates of attendance. The Port General Management class is split into 4 separate classes, scheduled for completion in mid-February 2009.

Aside from the courses being conducted, "**IT Training**" has commenced and is being conducted in a separate location (BPDE Cyber Room training room, located about 8 minutes drive from UNSYIAH training center). The IT Training took 5 days, covering Computer Introduction, Microsoft Office knowledge and Internet. The next IT Training is scheduled for the second week of February.

The "**English**" class consists of 25 participants attending the first course from 5 – 9 Jan. The complete module will take 25 days, divided into one week per month.

At the end of the first course the English class students put their knowledge to the test by translating a short speech in English.

At the end of each class student completed an "**evaluation / feedback form**". Preliminary findings show that students are pleased with the training and suggest an enthusiasm for the continuation of the training.

A Private Contractor (PT. Adhi Karya) continues to utilize a Manitou forklift for the Sinabang port construction project to assist in infrastructure development.

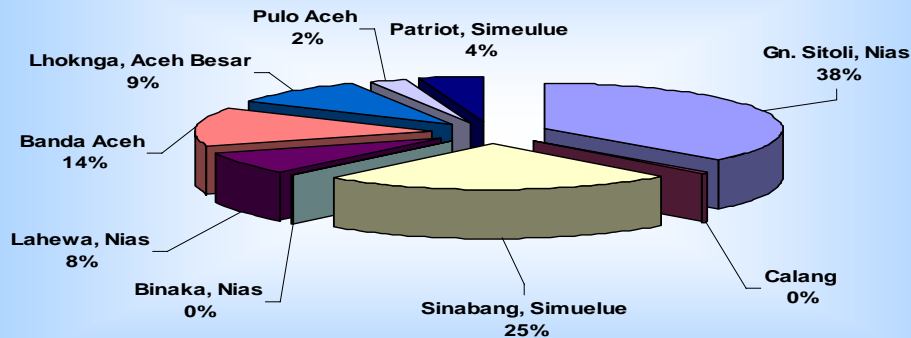
Nias
