

Updated on Subproject Selection Process

Project Management Unit (PMU) EDFD is pleased to announce that following the deadline of submission, the assessment and evaluation of the EDFD Sub-project Proposals has started in September 2009. The assessment is jointly conducted by the PMU and TA Experts assisting the PMU.

The assessment and evaluation process is based on the requirements and criteria mentioned in the EDFD Call for Proposals.

The assessment and evaluation is carefully conducted through a number of successive phases. The assessment starts with the Administrative Check during the opening of Sub-project Proposals. During this Administrative Check the main administrative requirements in the Call for Proposals are checked. Proposals passing this check then enter the Phase I Technical Check during which a number of essential technical requirements are checked. Phase I is followed by the Technical Check of Phase II and III during which the feasibility of the Sub-project and implementing capacity of the concerned SIE is evaluated and final scores defined.

After the completion of the technical checks and evaluation the resulting evaluation grids are reviewed by an independent Selection Committee. The results of the review by the Committee are then forwarded to the World Bank for further review and No Objection Letter (NOL).

Next the SIEs provisionally selected are invited by the PMU for negotiations on technical and financial components in the Sub-Project Proposal. The result of the negotiations could very well be that the Proposal might require a number of amendments.

After the completion of the negotiations and receipt of detailed sub-project preparation documents from the sub-project proponent, the PMU undertakes its final review and subsequently will submit its recommendations to the World Bank for getting the final NOL.

Following the NOL the winning SIEs are invited to sign the grant contract. More details on the assessment/ evaluation process are shown in the FLOW CHART of Sub-project Selection.

With a relatively large number of proposals to be evaluated and the various steps taken, the overall effort requires utmost attention and concentration for all involved.

In order to allow the evaluation process to be undertaken with the utmost care and highest degree of professionalism and to avoid further delays as well, you may understand that it will not be possible to attend to any written or verbal requests on the status of the selection until final selection is done.

Your cooperation on this matter is highly appreciated.
